The CCB board is happy to announce that we will be offering a monthly installment plan option for the 2021 season.

Here's how it works.

Memberships are broken down into a 10 month payment period from January thru October. To start, you pay a down payment pro-rated to January plus an additional processing fee to cover the monthly transactions. For example, if you start in April, you would pay 4 months plus the processing fees up front, and then pay the remaining balance in 6 installments which will automatically be deducted from the card on file.


As March soon approaches, we have certainly experienced a true Vermont winter thus far. Two plus feet of snow currently blankets our golf course providing plenty of protection to our turf.

Now is the time we bring each piece of equipment into our maintenance facility. Preventive maintenance, repairs and reel sharpening is performed. Each piece is gone through thoroughly in preparation of the upcoming season. Maintenance is critical to the performance and life of each piece.

April will be a very busy month for the maintenance staff, with quite a bit of clean up from tree removals and pine branches that are down from some heavy snow load. Final grading and sodding of our 9th tee will be addressed along with some much needed irrigation work

In addition to routine maintenance, there have been discussions about potential tree removal between the 8th and 9th holes. The short pines will be removed and that area will be seeded with native fescue. There are multiple reasons for this project.

1. Maintenance costs grow each year as the trees drop branches and become larger and more expensive to cut down. 2. As the trees canopy grows each year the turf surrounding the tree is stressed to compete for nutrients and sunlight. 3. The trees were never an integral part of the hole design but simply planted many years later to help distinguish the boundaries. 4. With the OB stakes removed after building the new 8th tee box, these trees are less needed to keep people from driving it down the 9th hole. Instead, native fescue will be grown in the same area to dissuade longer hitters from playing it down 9 on purpose. 5. The aesthetics after removing these trees will enhance the entire area and allow native grass to grow as the hole was originally designed. Growing fescue in this area will save the course resources because it wont need to be mowed nearly as often.
